The Georgia State University School of Music in partnership with the GSU Library and Johnny Mercer Foundation is pleased to offer three graduate assistantships for students enrolling in the Master of Music degree in Music Education.

THESE GRADUATE ASSISTANTSHIPS OFFER THE FOLLOWING TO RECIPIENTS:

(Recipients need to be enrolled as full-time students):

- 1 Tuition waiver for four semesters
- 2 \$2,000 stipend per semester for a total of \$8,000
- 3 Recipients receive personalized professional development to design and deliver an extended curriculum unit on American music 1900-1950. The focus of the unit may cover any aspect of this time period and is driven by the recipient's interest and supported by GSU music education faculty and library resources.

Recipients currently teaching in a school setting design a curriculum unit for their school and students.

Recipients not currently teaching in a school setting will design a curriculum unit for GSU partnership schools. The Master of Music Education degree typically is completed in two years by full-time students, with much of the coursework available in the evening or online.
